- Average Caseload
 - 50 to 1 in General Supervision
 - Roughly 35 to 1 in Special Supervision
- Supervision Intensity
 - * 12% place on GPS since November 1, 2009
 - * 51% supervised at Intensive/Maximum
 - 70% percent are on ACTIVE status
 - 8% of offenders have an active warrant
 - 9% are in jail or being detained
- Supervision Branch
 - 50% General Supervision
 - 18% Mental Health
 - 10% Domestic Violence
 - 8% HIDTA
 - 6% Interstate-In
 - 6% Sex Offender
 - 2% Traffic-Alcohol

Substance Abuse Service Needs

- 25% Treated for a substance abuse related condition within the past six months
- 20% Evaluated for a substance abuse related condition within the past month
- 24% Sought substance abuse counseling within the past month

Mental Health Service Needs

- 25% Ever been evaluated for or diagnosed with a mental disorder
- 26% Experience bouts of anxiety and/or depression
- 27% Feel that he/she can benefit from mental health counseling/therapy
- 19% Currently in a mental health treatment program
